
STEP BY STEP GUIDE TO FLIPPING A TRIPPED BREAKER



Understand the Basics:

- Location: Find where the breaker box is located in your home. It's usually in a utility room, basement, garage, or on an exterior wall.
- Main Breaker: This is the large switch that controls the power for the entire house. Turning it off cuts electricity to the entire home.
- Individual Breakers: These smaller switches control power to specific circuits, such as lights, outlets, or appliances.

STEP

Safety First:

 Turn Off Power: Before working on any electrical system, turn off the breaker that supplies power to that area.

STEP 2

Resetting a Tripped Breaker:

- Locate the Tripped Breaker: It will be in a different position (often in the middle or off position) compared to the others.
- Turn it Off and On: Push the breaker fully to the "off" position, then back to the "on" position. This should reset it.

STEP 3

Turning Off a Circuit:

- Find the Correct Breaker: Locate the breaker that controls the area or appliance you want to turn off.
- Switch Off: Flip the breaker to the "off" position. This will cut power to that circuit.

STEP 4

Troubleshooting Common Issues:

- Repeated Tripping: If a breaker keeps tripping, it may indicate an overloaded circuit, short circuit, or faulty breaker.
- Sparking or Burning Smell: If you notice sparking, buzzing, or a burning smell, turn off the main breaker

and contact a professional electrician immediately.
